



The Capitol's Grand Opening...




"Advance reports of the beauty of the new theatre have not been exaggerated one bit. In fact it is hard to do justice to the interior except to say that in beauty, comfort, equipment, construction and other ways, it equals, if it does not surpass any theatre of its size in the country... The base and floor of the lobby are of Venetian marble and the wainscoting and stairs are of light clouded marble. The ceiling is designed in a circle with eight inlaid panels from which is suspended a festooned dome of Bohemian cut class which flitters and glistens and sparkles like a myriad of diamonds" -- New London Day, 1921



"At present, the question is not what the city can do for the Capitol but what the Capitol can do for the city" – Lisa Brownell?






