This plan, by Skidmore, Owings & Merrill, is a guess, but an interesting and informed one. Some of this shape of things to come is already apparent. The new parking lot, for example, already exists between the Lyman Museum and the old parking lot south of Palmer Auditorium: site of the new Arts Center. The new road system at that end of the campus is also taking shape. The Library will probably have a U-shape addition wrapped around its present stacks, and behind it there





may someday be a new Academic Building over part of the present City Reservoirs. The college will probably need new dormitories within a decade. If so, where should they be built? This Master Plan recommends a site just east of the present North Complex with another new parking lot for more student cars. New faculty housing is planned for the hilltop beyond the riding stables, and the President's House may turn into a Faculty Club. Even the main entrance to the College will probably be moved across campus, opposite the Arboretum, when the new bridge brings increased traffic to Mohegan Avenue. All guesses, but let's come back for our 30th Reunion and see how many of them turn out to be true.
