# Current Events

The War in the Gulf; Iraq invades Kuwait, August 2, 1990; Fighting begins, January 16, 1991; Ceasefire, February 28, 1991



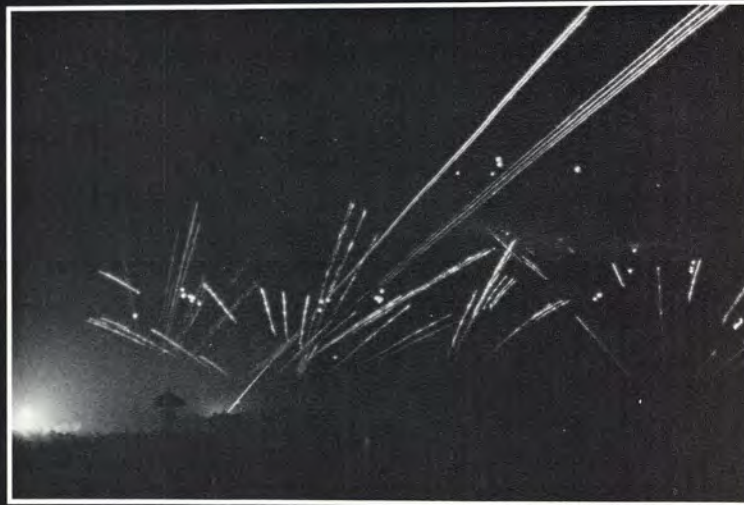
## August 1990, U.S. Army Troops Leave for Saudi Arabia

In response to the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait on August 2nd 1990 the U.S. deployed dozens of tanks and armored infantry fighting vehicles. As of mid-October more than 200,000 troops had been sent to the gulf to join other allied forces enforcing the U.N. resolutions. This number grew to 500,000 by February of 1991.



## Saddam Hussein

The 53-year-old Iraqi president brought massive destruction to the Persian Gulf by refusing to concede to the U.N. resolutions. He resorted to ecological warfare and abuse of civilians and POWs to strike out at the allied forces.



## Air Attack in Iraq

A powerful allied air force completed thousands of missions in an effort to destroy the Iraqi Air Force and disable weapon facilities. The bombing continued until the ceasefire, and effected both military and civilian areas. This fireworks display shows the anti-aircraft fire in Baghdad on January 17th, 1991.

## Ceasefire Talks

General Schwarzkopf and Khalid bin Sultan, of Saudi Arabia, met with Hashim Ahmed, chief of operations for the Iraqi armed forces, in Iraq on March 3, 1991. The Iraqis accepted the stringent allied terms for formally ending the Persian Gulf War which included quick release of all POWs and compliance with U.N. resolutions.

## June 1990 Summit Bush and Gorbachev

The leaders agreed to cut long range nuclear arms, ban the production of chemical weapons, reduce troops and conventional weapons in Europe, and settle a five year grain deal. The summit marked a new era for Soviet-American relations and set a precedent for future talks. "I think what is happening now... represents an event of momentous importance, not only for our two countries but for the world," said Gorbachev.

## Free Elections in Romania

Romanians had their first free elections in 53 years on May 20th 1990. The campaign of Iliescu promised a movement from the centralized socialist system to a free-market economy and to dismantle the Communist government. This triumph was an example of the liberation of Eastern Europe.



## Reunification of Germany October 3rd 1990

World leaders welcomed a united Germany into the international community at the stroke of midnight. The unification came 11 months after the Berlin Wall fell in a peaceful revolt that overthrew the Communist East German leaders.



## Soviet Military Imposed On Lithuania, January 13, 1991

The Soviet army imposed a curfew and declared a general in command of the Lithuanian capital Vilnius. This was the hardest measure taken by Gorbachev against the Baltic Republic since it declared independence on March 11, 1990.





## Nelson Mandela's World Tour

Massive crowds turned out for African National Congress leader Nelson Mandela at every stop on his six-week tour of North America, Europe and Africa. Mandela, one of the world's most celebrated political prisoners, was freed by the South African government in February of 1989 after 27 years in prison. He was serving a life sentence for allegedly plotting to overthrow the white government. On his tour he urged foreign governments to maintain sanctions against South Africa, raised funds for the ANC, and explained the goals of his movement. The ANC aims to create a non-racial democracy and to distribute the nation's wealth more equally.

## Margaret Thatcher

Britain's first female Prime Minister resigned in November of 1990. After eleven years and three terms of holding the position with the Conservative Party her successor became John Major.



## David Souter Joins Supreme Court

David Souter, a previously little-known judge from New Hampshire became the 105th Supreme Court Justice in October 1990 after pledging to "do equal right to the poor and to the rich."



## Jim Henson

Muppeteer Jim Henson died in 1990. His service drew 5,000 mourners, the most this year, to New York's cathedral church St. John the Divine.

## Bart Simpson

Matt Groening's creation, "The Simpsons," an animated television parody of the American family, made Bart favorite character for 1990.

## The Issue of Censorship in America

### Flag Protection Act

The U.S. senate rejected a constitutional amendment against flag burning on June 26th. President Bush called for approval of the measure, which said simply that "Congress and the states shall have power to prohibit the physical desecration of the flag of the United States." But the House rejected it with Democratic leaders saying that it amounted to placing limits on freedom of speech.

### 2 Live Crew

With their "Nasty As They want To Be" album, the rap group attracted parental ire and Fundamentalist fire. No one denied the lyrics were raunchy, but the jurors at the group's obscenity trial acquitted the rappers.



## Homeless

A legion of clipboard-toting counters sought out shelters, subways and steam grates in March, 1990 in the broadest attempt ever to find out the extent of the homelessness since it became a national disgrace in the 1980s. Some homeless did not mind the government intrusion. "It shows that they're starting to recognize us as humans and not the scum of the earth," said one young man of the streets. The count of the homeless is now estimated at 250,000 to 3 million.



## Superbowl

Buffalo Bills kicker Scott Norwood, center, misses the field goal on the last play of the game, clinching the victory for the New York Giants in Superbowl XXV. The Giants won 20-19 in a game that kept fans in the seats and glued to the TV screen until the final second.



## Earth Day

On April 22, 1990 an estimated 200 million people all over the planet celebrated the 20th anniversary of Earth Day as activists pleaded for the rise of a new "conservation generation" to care for the fragile environment. In Washington, Earth Day founder Gaylord Nelson urged more than 100,000 people massed at the foot of the capitol to motivate politicians and corporate leaders into environmental action. "I don't want to come back here in 20 years from now and have to tell your sons and daughters that you didn't do your duty," said Nelson, 74, who originated Earth day when he was a senator from Wisconsin. "We've got to raise a conservation generation."

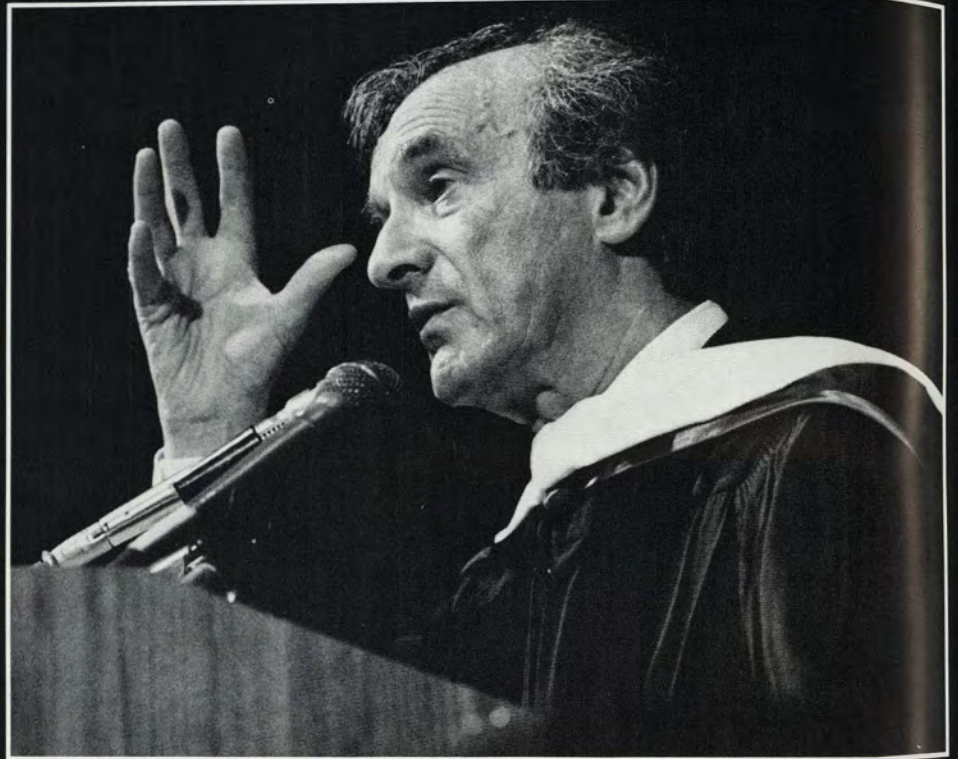


## Joseph Brodsky

Nobel Laureate Joseph Brodsky joined Victor Golishev, Valeri Popov, and Tatyana Beck for the Klagsbrun Symposium on Writing and Moral Vision this fall. The four Russian authors read their works and discussed them for the annual conference. Brodsky was involuntarily exiled from the Soviet Union in 1972 and is now a U.S. citizen. He received the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1987. The symposium is named after Daniel Klagsbrun '86 who was murdered in NYC shortly after his graduation.

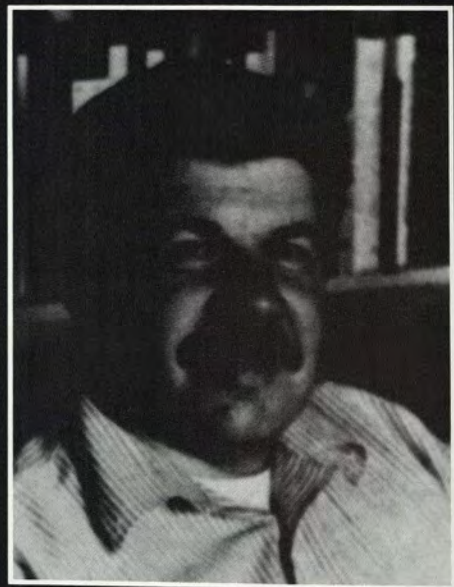
## Elie Weisel

A survivor of Auschwitz and the 1986 winner of the Nobel Peace Prize, Weisel spoke to the college community about "The Urgency of Learning" in Palmer Auditorium on September 15th. The world's first endowed professorship honoring Weisel has been established through a generous gift to Connecticut College, and the chair in Judaic Studies has been endowed by Jo Ann Hess Meyers, a 1967 graduate.



## Presentation of the "Campus of the Future" Award

On November 1st, Connecticut College was recognized as the nation's first liberal arts college with a telecommunications infrastructure capable of handling voice, data and video communication. It was officially designated a "Campus of the Future" by SNET and AT&T systems.



## Stephen Jay Gould

Gould, the country's leading paleontologist and a professor at Harvard University spoke to students in Palmer. The lecture, entitled "The Evolutionary Perspective: Charles Darwin's Revolution in Thought," celebrated the new telecommunications system.

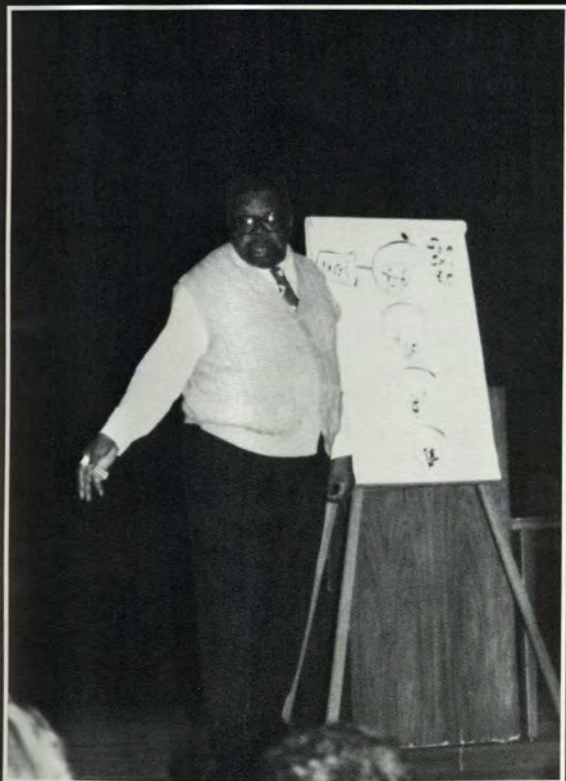

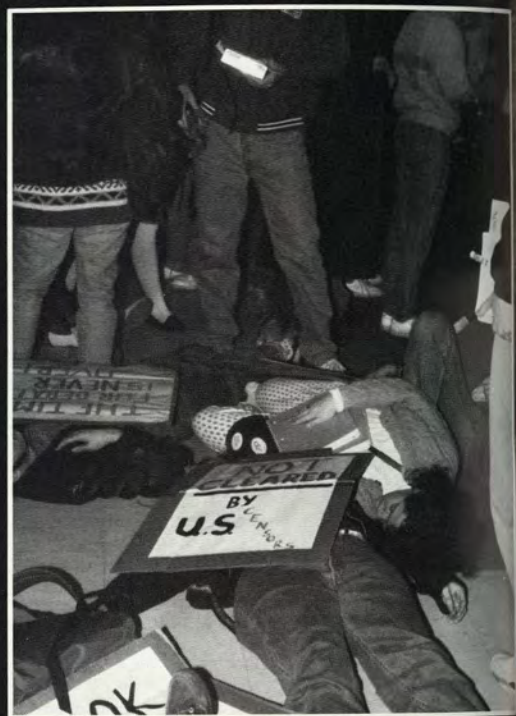




## Conn Reacts to the Gulf War

Connecticut College students returned to campus only five days after the war in the Persian Gulf began. The first evening, students, faculty and administrators gathered in the dorms to discuss the events in the middle east. A vigil for peace was held in the chapel that same night.

The college then organized the Gulf War Dialogue Series which examined different topics concerning the war in weekly panel discussions. A support group for faculty, staff and students who had friends or family involved in the war was also formed. On January 31st SGA organized a ribbon tying ceremony in honor of the American troops which included speeches by students and administrators. Pictured above is Shannon Range '91 speaking at the gathering. The ceremony was followed by tying ribbons around the trees that line Cro Boulevard. Students also organized a pro-peace group to plan protests and invite speakers to campus. On the afternoon of February 21st Students for Peace staged a die-in in the post office. The group also planned day-long activities for the college community in Blaustein which included a teach-in instructed by various faculty members. Later that night, Students for Peace staged a second die-in in Cro and marched across campus. The ceasefire in the Persian Gulf in March came as a relief to the whole college community.



## OVCS Receives Presidential Action Award

Connecticut College was selected from a pool of 3,500 nominees of individuals, corporations and organizations to receive one of the nineteen 1991 Presidential Volunteer Action Awards. Debo Adegbile '91 was chosen as the representative for the college to receive the award. He travelled with Anais Troadec, director of OVCS, to Washington D.C. to accept it at the White House on April 25th. This is the first time in the history of the award that it has been awarded to a college.



# Earth Day 1991 at Connecticut College

The day-long activities planned for Harkness Green were rained out on April 21st. Spirits were not dampened though, as the student group Students Against Violence to the Environment (S.A.V.E.) reorganized the activities for inside Cro. The celebration brought music from local musicians, dance from the Children's Dance Center and the African American Dance Ensemble as well as wandering entertainers. There were many environmental education booths offering information and literature while others sold imported goods and international foods. All the activities were open to the public as part of the Southeastern Connecticut Earth Day celebration.



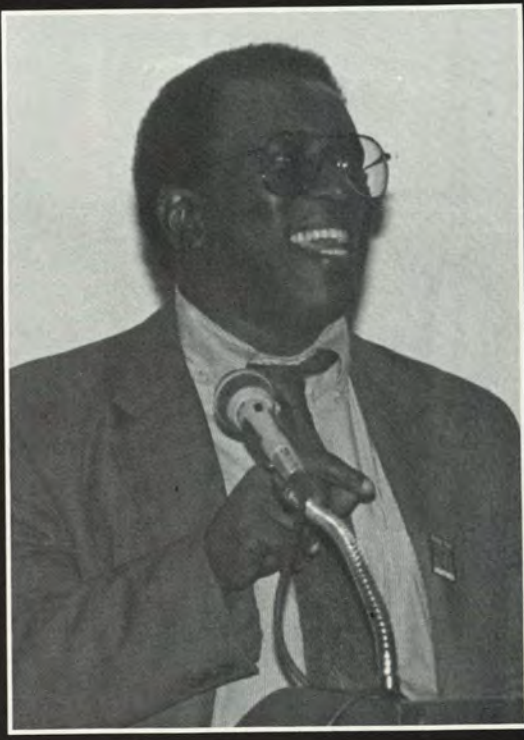
**Harry Mattison**

**Dumisani Kumalo**  
On April 24th in Oliva Hall, Dumisani Kumalo, a South African journalist, spoke to the college community of the struggle for freedom in South Africa. Kumalo fled to the United States in 1977 because of police harrassment for his writing of the abuses of police power, holding without charge or trial, and conditions of black migrant workers in the mines. His message was to continue sanctions and fight for the destruction of apartheid. He said "The reason South Africa will never know peace is because apartheid still exists."

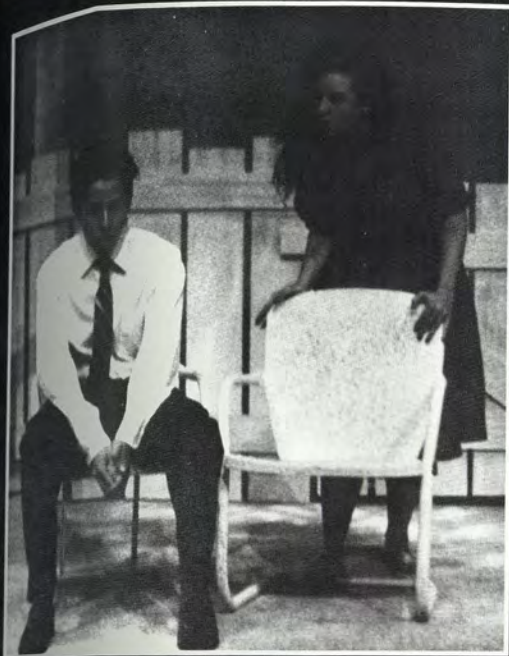
# Theater

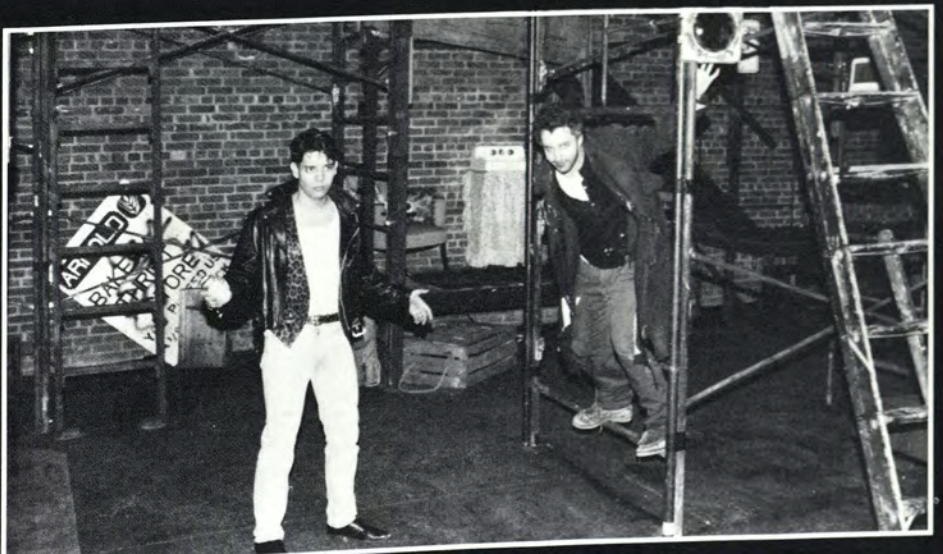
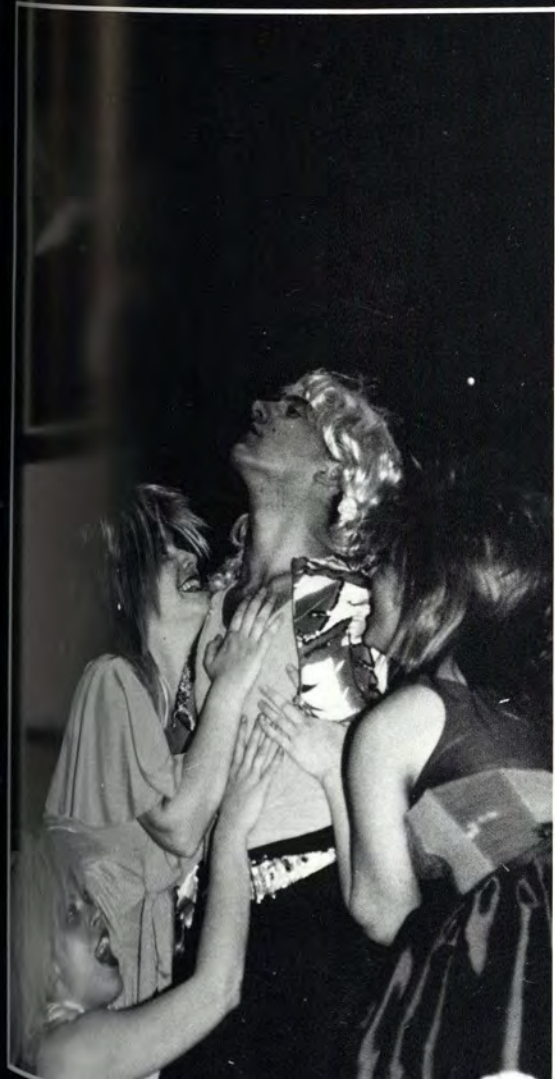






## Road

Their performances blend West African traditional dance with contemporary African American works through colorful costumes, masterful choreography and pulsating rhythms.

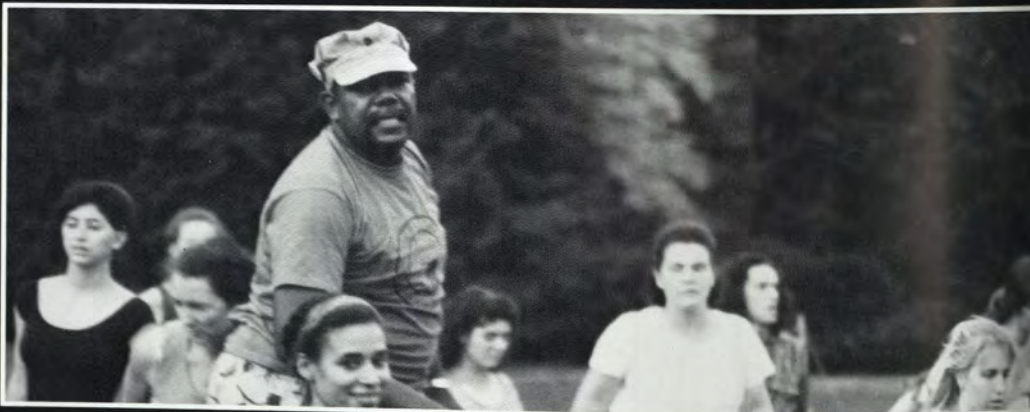

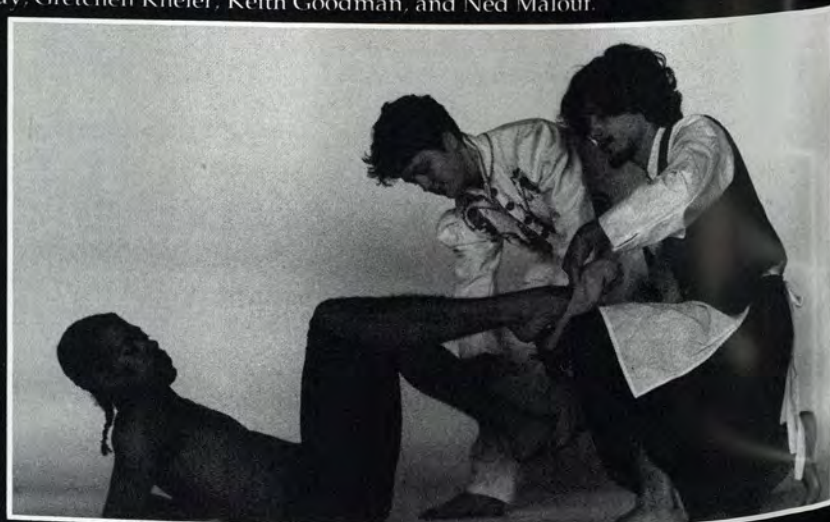




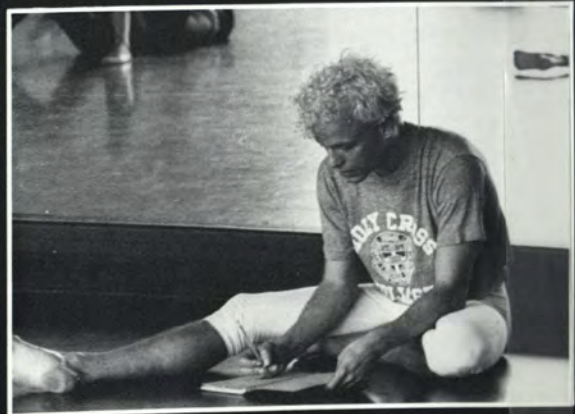
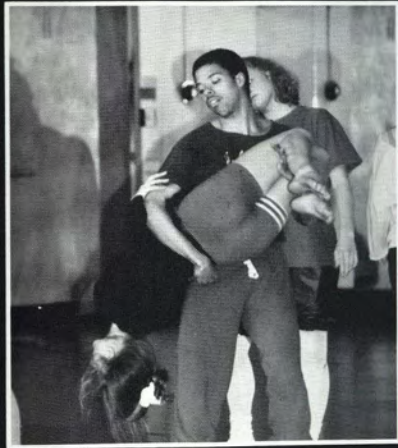
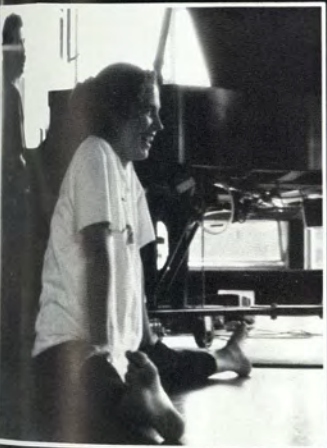
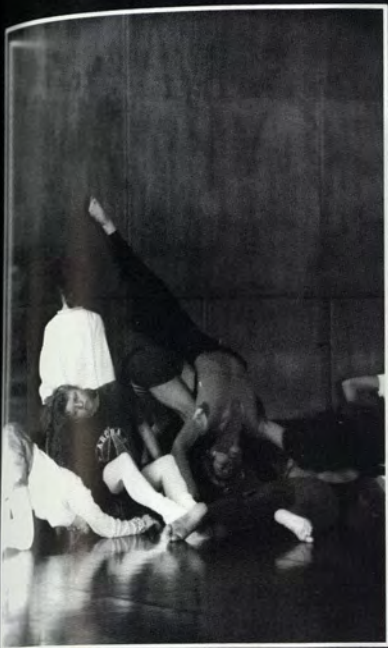
# *susan davis & friends*

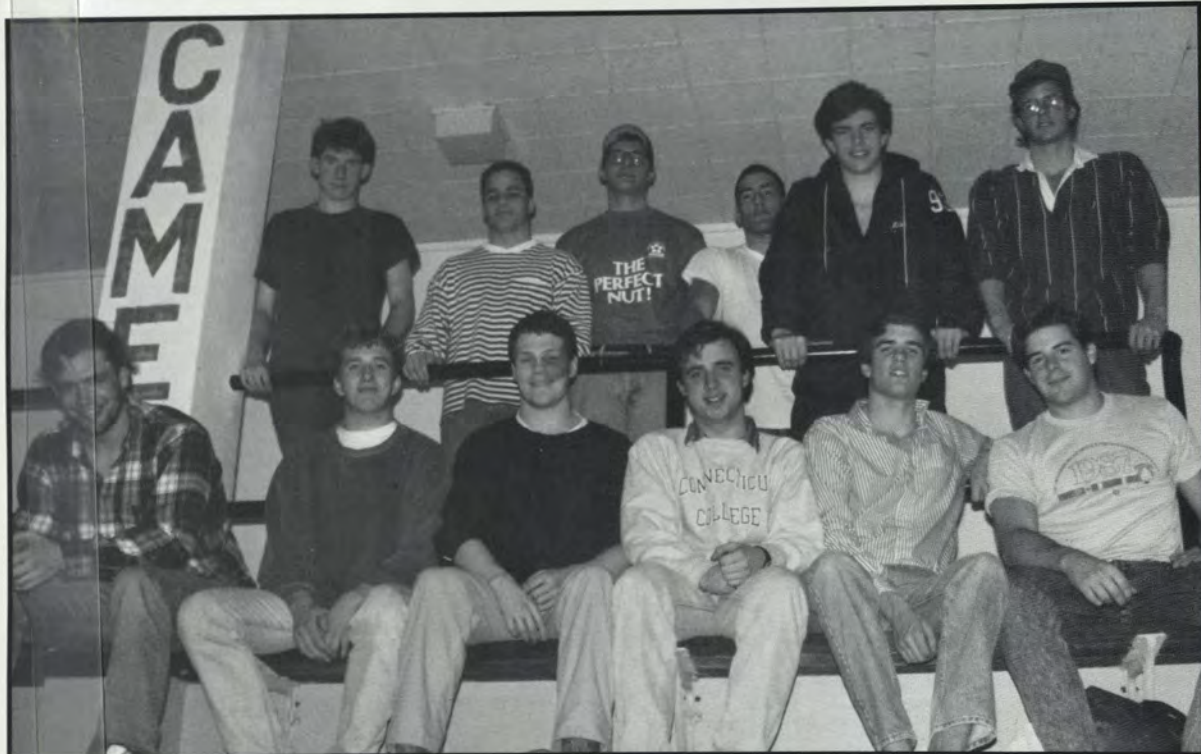


# MEN'S SWIMMING

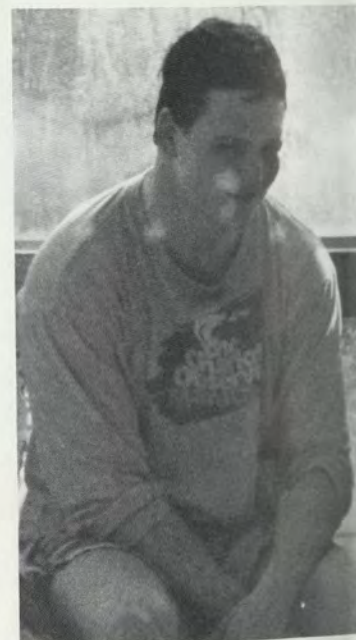

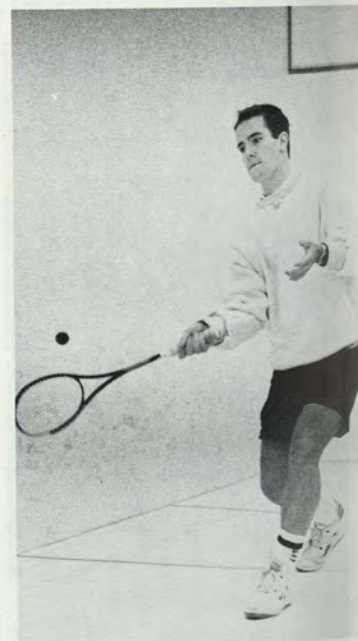
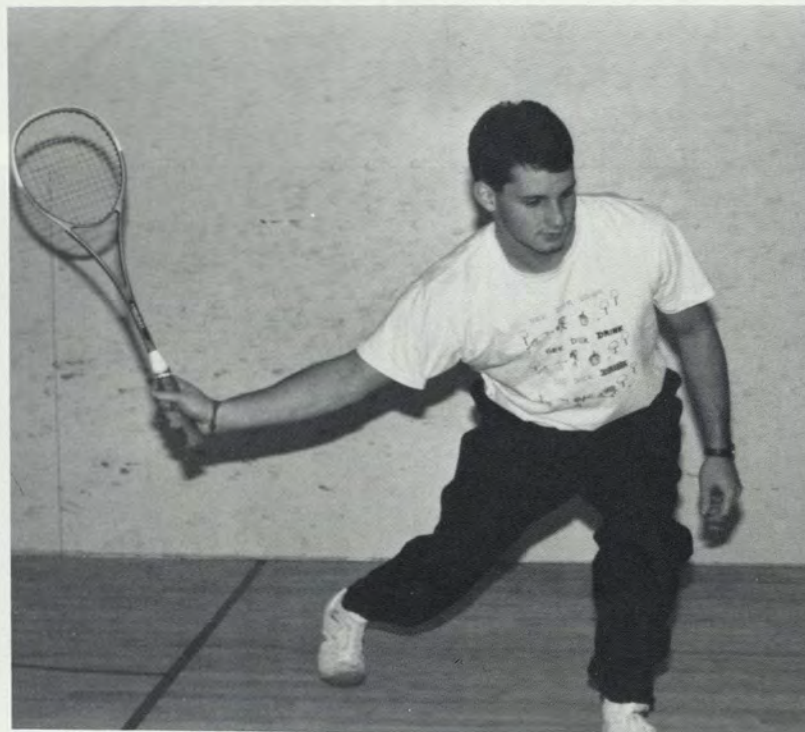

Kessler and Chris Perkins and will lose the leadership and dedication of seniors Paul Harris, Jim Luchars, and John Yearout.



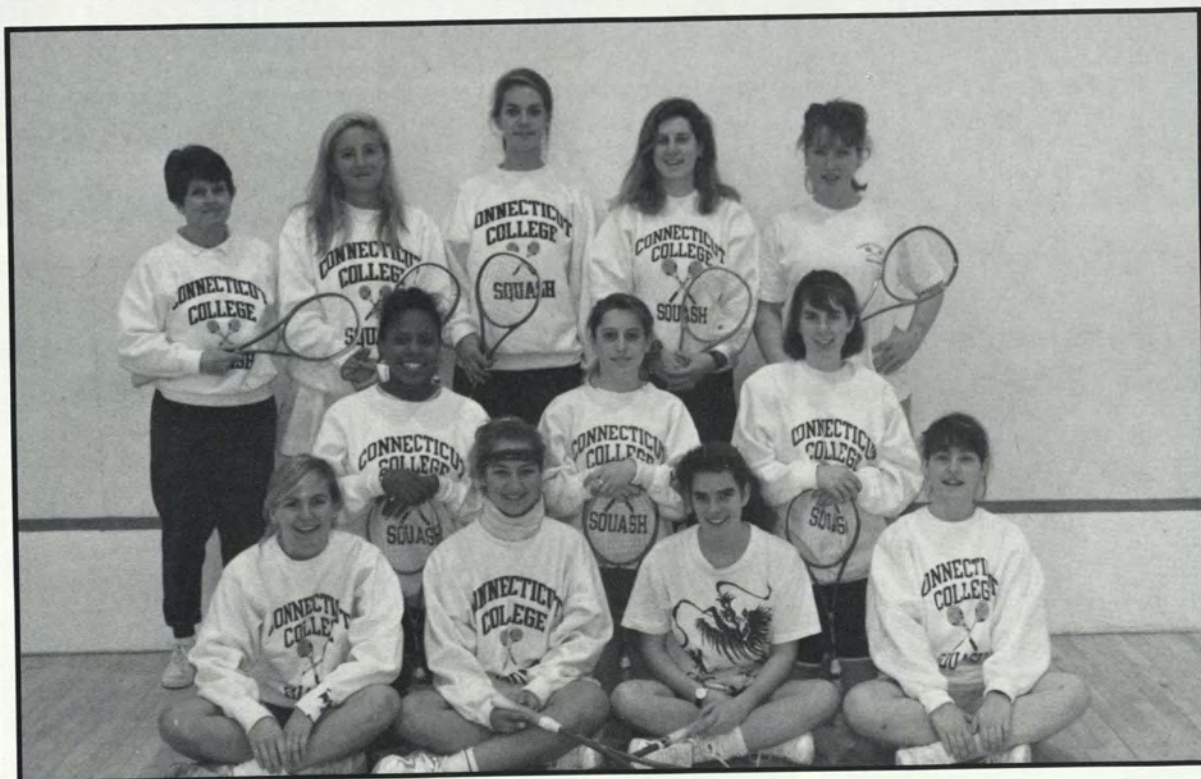

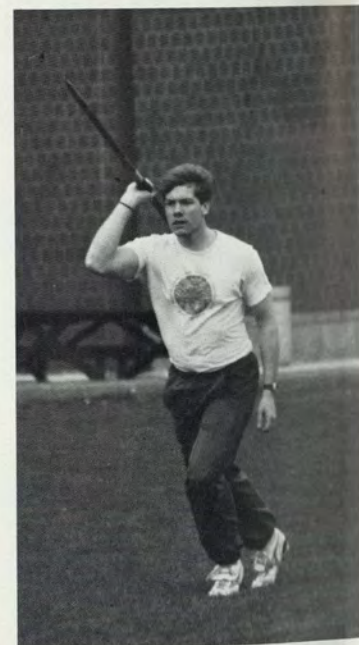
won his heat in the 800 meter race. Overall, he received second being edged out by hundredths of a second. Todd also qualified for New England where he placed third.
