## A MESSAGE TO THE CLASS OF 2005

Good afternoon. Class of 2005, it's great to see you so happy, so relieved, so expectant. You graduate Connecticut College this afternoon ready to take on the world - equipped with knowledge, skills and experiences that will serve you well for decades to come.

Your liberal education has given you answers. Even more important, it has given you questions: the questions you will repeatedly ask yourself over the course of your life - the questions that permit you to lead a self-conscious and self-reflective life, to lead the best kind of life.

In the years to come, you will have fond memories of your college years. I've met hundreds - even thousands - of alums. They share their memories with me. To a person they recall the beauty of the campus - and then the warmth of the community that lives in its precincts.

It has become rather fashionable in recent scholarship to discuss the landscape we have built and their meanings. Books abound with names like "landscapes of power" and "landscapes of empire."

So let's be fashionable. Why don't you take a moment to reflect upon the "landscape of college" - in particular, the landscape of Connecticut College. As you do so, you will find that this landscape not only reflects past values and practices, it also poses metaphorically many of the questions that you will take through life.

Of course, there are some aspects of the College landscape and its memories best left private, and others, no doubt, best forgotten. But what of the ones that you can discuss around the family dinner table tonight?

Look around. What do we see? Start with the academic buildings that stand on the northern and eastern borders of this splendid green: Blaustein, New London, Fanning, Bill and Cummings. They juxtapose the academic homes of the humanities, natural sciences, social sciences and the creative arts - the pillars of a liberal education. You have been in all of them. Whatever your major, whatever your interests, you have acquired the basic knowledge and the tools to lead the life of a thinking person. Most of you are 21 or 22. Let me assure you from the vantage point of 60 that your educations have only begun.

Our mission statement is short and accurate: Connecticut College educates students to put the liberal arts into action as citizens in a global society. Ask yourself today what the liberal arts mean to you, how you have and will translate your education to action, and what kind of citizen you wish to be in what kind of global society.

On the western side of the green we find residence halls: Knowlton and Harkness, Adams and Freeman, places you will remember forever if you have lived there - and also places that symbolize another component of the Connecticut College education.

For we are not just a liberal arts college, we are a residential liberal arts college. And we are not just a residential liberal arts college, we are one with shared governance - a place where all of our students shape the kind of community in which they live.

That community is far from perfect - indeed it will always be a work in progress. But I happen to think it is a very special kind of place - a place where students from all over America, from all over the world, work and play together, learn from one another, respect differences of view and find for themselves the basic elements that make us all human. When you leave the confines of this very special kind of community, will you keep it before you as a model for your own life and work? Will you seek out people who are different from you? Will you take responsibility - as you have here - for shaping the communities in which you live?

I believe you will.



You sit today on some of the most beautiful playing fields in America, playing fields placed right in the middle of the academy, surrounded, as I have noted, by the buildings in which you learn and live. When I walk across this green I always think that its placement tells us something about how the mind and body should be connected - that they should be understood to be dialectically intertwined and inseparable.

Yet their needs are different, their nourishment is different, the time we commit to one may detract from the time available for the other. Be self-conscious about both your mind and body - ask yourself today, and years from today, how you have balanced the needs of the two. Leave here having learned the question that only you can answer, that you must answer in your own way.

Not quite in sight - its spire just visible through the trees - sits Harkness Chapel, reminding us that a liberal education should touch the soul, as well as the mind and body. The architecture of the chapel is clearly Christian, as is much of the imagery inside. For many years, a cross was mounted on the chapel steeple. In spite of its architecture, the chapel today has taken on an interfaith role, open to Christians and non-Christians alike - indeed, open to those who do not profess a religious belief, but seek spirituality within its walls. For me, at least, the presence of the chapel on our campus says much about our education of the whole person - about our belief that the questions of life cannot be answered through reason alone. But the chapel also raises questions that you will be facing time and again in your personal and political lives. What, exactly, should be the balance between faith and reason? How do we simultaneously hold religious beliefs - or even those antagonistic to religion - and yet find room to tolerate the views of others?

Open to the newspapers or watch TV for an hour and you will find both questions in play.

When I was your age I assumed that these issues had been settled once and for all. I assumed that over time religious proselytizing, much less religious persecution - would be steadily on the wane. I assumed that science and religion had learned to cohabit in the same society, and even in the same people, sometime in the 18th century, and that we would never see that war flare up again.

I was wrong on both counts. It is now up to you to decide for yourselves and for future generations in our global societies where we should strike the balance between religious commitment and religious tolerance, between religious belief and human reason.

Now extend your vision further, beyond the chapel and beyond Williams Street to the College arboretum. Our built campus is surrounded, as you all know, by an arboretum of nearly 700 acres, much of what is kept in a natural condition. Most of you have spent time in the Arboretum and some have done research there. For all of us, the arboretum and campus symbolize the connection between the natural and built environments, between nature and humankind.

And that connection raises the existential questions you will answer through your lives and through your actions. Humans are a part of the natural world. What does that knowledge tell us, if anything, about human destiny? Should knowledge of natural law shape our moral values?

Humans are masters of the natural world - at least for now! What are our obligations as masters? How should we balance present human needs - including the needs of impoverished peoples around the world - with our obligations to our children and grandchildren?

Finally, step back even further - imagine you are in a balloon up a thousand feet - and look at our campus as a whole, and at the town below it. When it was built, our college educated young women. Like many other women's colleges, it was situated away from the town and surrounded by a wall. Women's colleges were commonly constructed that way so that the women would be safe from prying eyes, so that the women could be kept under surveillance, so that female behavior could be best controlled.

Much has changed since 1911. Somehow I doubt the founders of this college could have imagined co-ed bathrooms. I am still not used to the idea.



Yet much remains unchanged. We live in an idyllic campus - on top of the hill, if not the City on the Hill envisioned by our Puritan forbearers. Even though we devote thousands of hours of work each year to the New London community, we live in a protected enclave of privilege. And that privilege is shared by every single one of you - regardless of your family background, regardless of race and ethnicity, regardless of national origin. For every one of you has received a Connecticut College education and every one of you is prepared to become a leader in whatever walk of life you choose.

In a few hours you will figuratively and literally move off campus and into the town, not necessarily New London, but, as I have heard you say, into the real world. That is a world of increasing inequality, a world where we are tempted to seek safety and security behind the walls of nice neighborhoods and even gated communities.

Think about privileged Connecticut College sitting here on the hill and overlooking the real world of New London, a working-class town that is home to many recent immigrants. Ask yourselves today and especially when you take on responsibilities for others, how you will strike the balances of life. Will you create an enclave for yourselves and your loved ones? Will you feel strongly your obligations to others? How will you strike the balance?

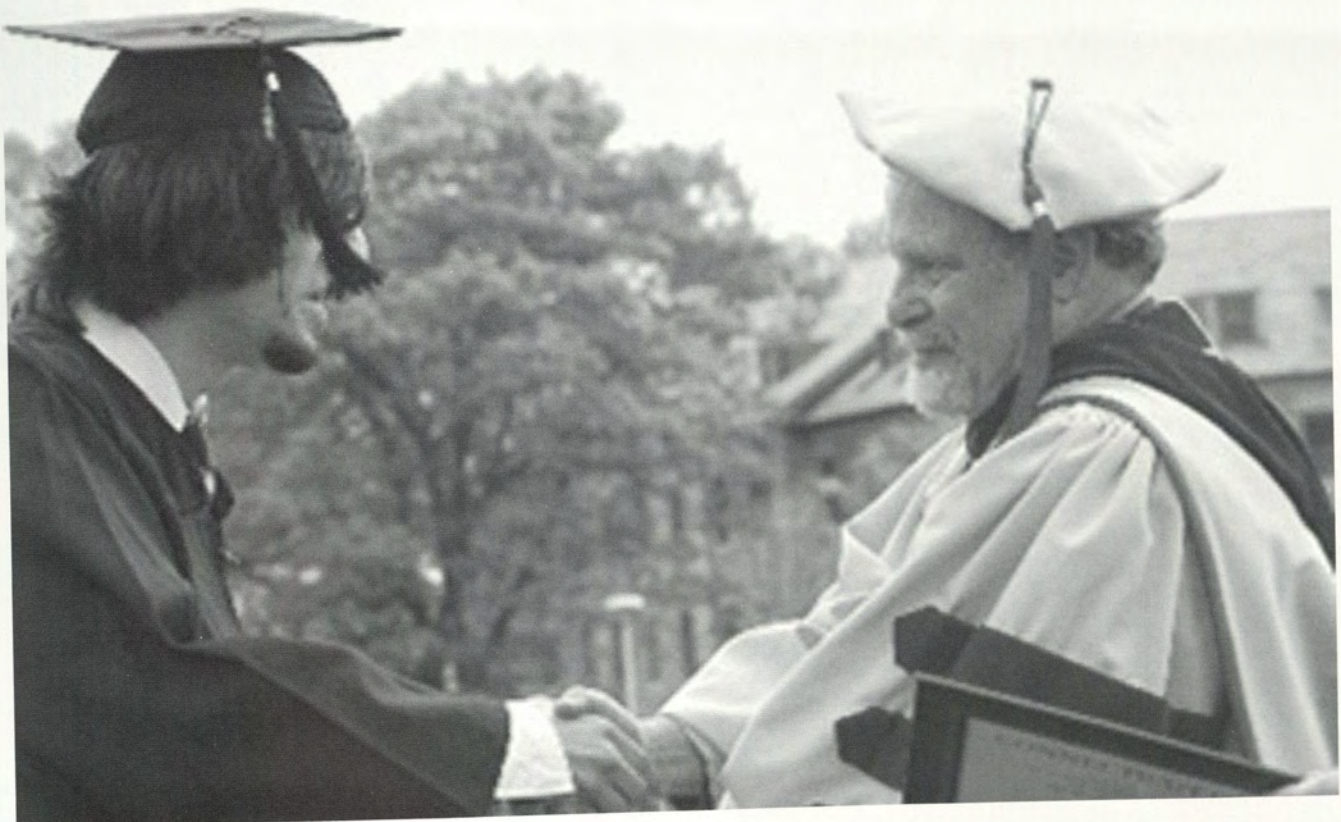
On what scale will you feel obligation and a sense of community? Can you both be a patriot of America or your own country and be a citizen of a global society? If you can, then Connecticut College has truly fulfilled its educational mission. It has truly prepared you to put the liberal arts into action as a citizen in a global society.

This beautiful campus symbolically raises all of the questions you will need to carry with you through your lives.

Remember them. Answer them with reason and with passion. Lead beautiful lives.
